An empty nest couple wanted to enhance their indoor/outdoor living opportunities but respect the architectural integrity of their contemporary home. The coastal property did not offer any land to build an addition, which limited the square footage that could be added to the existing house. An imaginative solution relocated the kitchen to the second level and incorporated an addition there.

The open design necessitated the removal of interior walls, and now floor-to-ceiling folding glass doors emphasize a connection to the outdoors. A louvered roof, glass side panels, remote-control recessed screens, infrared heating elements, fireplace, entertainment center and barbecue area set apart the outdoor living space—and can deliver a comfortable experience in any kind of weather.

A young professional woman with a love of bright colors and unorthodox ideas sought to convert her bland bathroom into a compelling and vibrant space. The proximity to a beach and one of her favorite paintings inspired the new design, which started with the decision to build a curved wall of sparkling tile that features an intricate bohemian texture in shades of blue and a built-in bench.

The curved alder wood bench anchors a free-standing tub in chartreuse, and its earthiness (along with other wood elements throughout the room) helps balance the bright colors. A chartreuse wall of tile shimmers with dimensional texture and includes a trio of windows that bring natural light into the space. An alder wood vanity with petrified wood handles connects to a table and bench.
